



Recycling: Plastic beads

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Step 1 Material, i.e. plastic waste, is collected in offices and companies in Antananarivo.



Step 2 Selected colours are combined while the plastic is being heated. The bead is gradually built-up.



Step 3 With the use of a small metal mould, the bead is getting its final shape.



Step 4) M. Germain Ramdriamaivo is presenting his assortment. He has been a designer and artisan making beads from recycled plastic for 35 years. His wife, Mme Blondine, takes care of the business and sales. The two grown up
